Supply Chain Transportation & Logistics 200 course descriptions:

BLOCK A

Transportation System

The course provides learners with an effective foundation to best manage or design omni-channel global transportation logistics systems. Realistic case study and discussion-based learning helps professionals streamline decision making to minimize errors that can lead to increased costs on various fronts.

Logistics Processes

Applied to simple modal choices or complex projects, you will learn to move materials, finished goods and information efficiently through all points and processes before, between and after transportation links from source to destination, on a national and international scale.

Economic Influence on Logistics

The course helps learners relate economic forces to costing, pricing and operating logistics operations within a business enterprise. Learners will gain a deeper understanding of macroeconomic trends, government intervention and how to capitalize on microeconomic levers.

Transportation Law

The course focuses on sector-relevant legislation, regulations, and contract law to limit personal and corporate exposure. This helps learners develop a deep understanding of how sector-specific, Canadian legislation is applied and how commercial contracts and claims work across all modes of transportation.

Project Management

The course defines the key project management terms and provides a basic understanding of project management methodology. It explains how the various project management processes commonly interact during the project life cycle and provides an understanding of the project deliverables.

Integrated Logistics

The course helps learners create efficient, silo-free logistic systems and decision-making environments, integrating all activities involved in the cost-effective and uninterrupted movement of materials and information from their source to the point-of-consumption.
